Reflective question and practice from Sunday February 12th

Reflective readings and questions for the week of February 12-18

Luke 7:1-10

(1): What did the centurion mean when he said he too, was a man of authority? What did that have to do with Jesus?

(2): What was unusual about the centurion's request and why did Jesus marvel/amazed at his faith?

Luke 7:11-17

(1): What caused Jesus to respond to the widow in her sorrow?

(2): After Jesus raised the man from the dead, what does the text say He did to him?

(3): What insight do you gain about Jesus in this incident, and how can you become like Him in this?

Luke 7:18-35

(1): What was John's question? Why do you think he asked this?

(2): What is the relationship of John's ministry with that of Jesus and how should this affect you?

Luke 7:36-50

(1): How did Simon the Pharisee let Jesus know He did not measure up?

(2): What do you find surprising about the behavior of the sinful woman?

Luke 8:1-15

(1): What type of soil would you be in the parable of the sower? Why?

(2): Why do you think Luke includes the information about the women following Jesus? What is their significance?

Luke 8:16-25

(1): How do Jesus' words about His true kindred impact you?

(2): Were the disciples justified in their fear of the storm? Why or why not?

Luke 8:26-39

(1): Why were the demons able to see Jesus for who He truly was?

(2): Why do you think the demons, when released into the pigs, hurled themselves into the sea?

(3): Who is the first commissioned evangelist in Luke?
